Introduction

In the academic year 2020-121 we received £22,360. The money has been spent to fulfil the following grant conditions, additional money was invested by school to supplement our sports premium.

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increasing participation in competitive sport.

Over the year there will be over 50 planned events across all topics of the curriculum. As well as the events, we will also receive curriculum and assessment support, a 6 week out of hours cub, sports leaders training, bus tokens and a sporting fundraiser to help us fund our extracurricular trips e.g., skiing and outdoor learning trips. Transport to events	To help subsidise the cost of transport to events this year where we cannot use the school mini-bus.	The school mini bus can be used to transport children to and from events. Sports Equipment	Investment will be made in updating, replenishing and revamping the sports equipment and kit that we have in school. A variation of sporting activities will be taken into account when making these purchases. This will include all essential PE equipment such as bibs, balls, cones and gymnastics mats. Due to Covid-19 restrictions on mixing/sharing we will be purchasing more equipment so children can have one each in lessons or a spare set whilst one set is cleaned.	The quality of kit will be looked at on a year-by-year basis. It is projected that the majority of expensive equipment (including basketball nets and football goal nets) purchases will last between 3-5 years before replacements are needed. PE essentials (e.g., bibs, balls, cones etc) will be replaced every 1-2 years.	Increased numbers of pupils accessing competitive sports in school and joining teams or signing up for events which allow them to represent the school. Safety ensured in PE lessons due to equipment being in correct working order. Duration of PE lessons being active increased per pupil due to extra equipment being available. Active 30 Fortnight	As a result of Covid-19 lockdown and restrictions we are planning to host two weeks of different sporting experience. Using external providers to provide a different offer to the children. Activities will include yoga, skipping, fitness etc. This will help us increase children's daily exercise rates back to 30 minutes per day in school and encourage them to do more outside of school. A whole school approach from all members of staff will help embed this ethos throughout the school.	External providers were not able to come into school however some were completed virtually.	Increased participation in a wider range of sport activities. Holiday Camps	To further engage children in activity and to ensure interest in sports and activity levels are high all year around we will provide free holiday sports clubs for our children via our specialist coach. Children will able to access a wide range of activities to keep them healthy and active during holiday times. This will also ease pressure on parents who generally have to find suitable childcare during these times.	We will continue to raise funds with school fund raisers to allow the children to access sport in school holidays.	Increased participation in sport outside of school.
