Introduction

In the academic year 2021-22 we received £19,360. The money has been spent to fulfil the following grant conditions, additional money was invested by school to supplement our sports premium.

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increasing participation in competitive sport.

This cost will also include any cover/supply costs we incur during the year. The courses they will attend will vary and cover all topics of the curriculum to ensure best practice back in school.
