## Introduction

In the academic year 2020-21 we will receive £19,360 plus £3,000 underspend from 2019-20, due to Covid-19. The money will be spent to fulfil the following grant conditions; additional money may be invested by school to supplement our sports premium.

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increasing participation in competitive sport.

<b>Stanley Learning Partnership Schools Sports SLA</b>	<p>Stanley Learning Partnership and the local SGO created a calendar of events for local schools sign up to. Over the year there will be over 50 planned events across all topics of the curriculum.</p> <p>As well as the events, we will also receive curriculum and assessment support, a 6 week out of hours club, sports leaders training, bus tokens and a sporting fundraiser to help us fund our extracurricular trips e.g., skiing and outdoor learning trips.</p>	1 year	1, 2, 3, 4 & 5	£1,500
<b>Employment of specialist PE coach</b>	<p>Employing a specialist PE coach will ensure all staff are upskilled in curriculum topics and lunch staff are upskilled with lunchtime activities. The coach will also lead on high quality after school clubs and lead school teams at events.</p> <p>The coach will also lead on movement interventions for SEN and other identified children with a focus on gross and fine motor skills.</p>	1 year	1, 2, 3, 4 & 5	£5,000
<b>Transport to events</b>	To help subsidise the cost of transport to events this year where we cannot use the school mini-bus.	1 year	4 & 5	£2,000
<b>Sports Equipment</b>	Investment will be made in updating, replenishing and revamping the sports equipment and kit that we have in school. A variation of sporting activities will be taken into account when making these purchases. This will include all essential	1 year	4	£4,000

	PE equipment such as bibs, balls, cones and gymnastics mats. Due to Covid-19 restrictions on mixing/sharing we will be purchasing more equipment so children can have one each in lessons or a spare set whilst one set is cleaned.			
<b>Active 30 Fortnight</b>	As a result of Covid-19 lockdown and restrictions we are planning to host two weeks of different sporting experience. Using external providers to provide a different offer to the children. Activities will include yoga, skipping, fitness etc. This will help us increase children's daily exercise rates back to 30 minutes per day in school and encourage them to do more outside of school. A whole school approach from all members of staff will help embed this ethos throughout the school.	1 year	2	£2,500
<b>Holiday Camps</b>	To further engage children in activity and to ensure interest in sports and activity levels are high all year around we will provide free holiday sports clubs for our children via our specialist coach. Children will be able to access a wide range of activities to keep them healthy and active during holiday times. This will also ease pressure on parents who generally have to find suitable childcare during these times.	1 year	1, 2, 4&5	£1,000
<b>Subsidy of Outdoor Learning Trips</b>	Years 3/4 and 5/6 will have residential trips this year where they will engage in a range of outdoor pursuits focused on building their experience, engagement and enthusiasm for less traditional activities including gorge walking, gill scrambling, archery, climbing, trapeze and caving. This will take place in the Summer term.	1 year	2&4	£1,000
<b>Outdoor and Adventurous Activities</b>	We will invest in our outdoor area and staffs forest school skills this year. All staff will undergo CPD training in outdoor lessons, active numeracy and literacy. Staff will be able to use the forest school and grass areas for all lessons to add an active element or teach about the environment. Along with CPD, we will invest in equipment for sports such as archery and orienteering for the outdoor area. This will allow us to give our children to experience different sports whilst in school and gain map reading skills.	1 year	1, 2, 3&4	£3,000
<b>Subject Lead Training and County PE Courses</b>	The PE subject lead will continue their professional development in the PE role by attending subject leadership courses across the year. The PE lead will also attend training courses provided by the local authority to upskill their knowledge	1 year	3	£2,500

	and share with members of staff in school and our specialist coach. This cost will also include any cover/supply costs we incur during the year. The courses they will attend will vary and cover all topics of the curriculum to ensure best practice back in school.
